

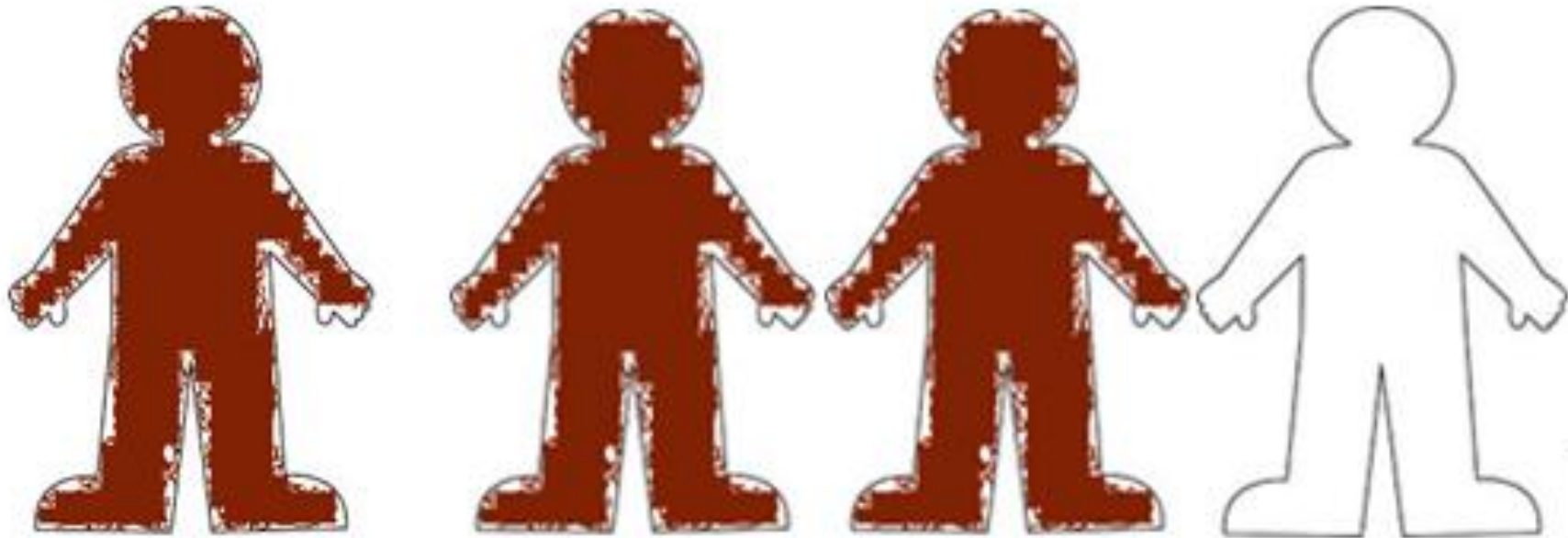

What happens to students who don't promote from Mae Hensley?

- *Not on track for High School graduation: 3 of 4 (74%)*



What happens to students who don't promote from Mae Hensley?

- *Not on track to be eligible for a 4-year college (not UC A-G ready): 4 of 4 (96%)*



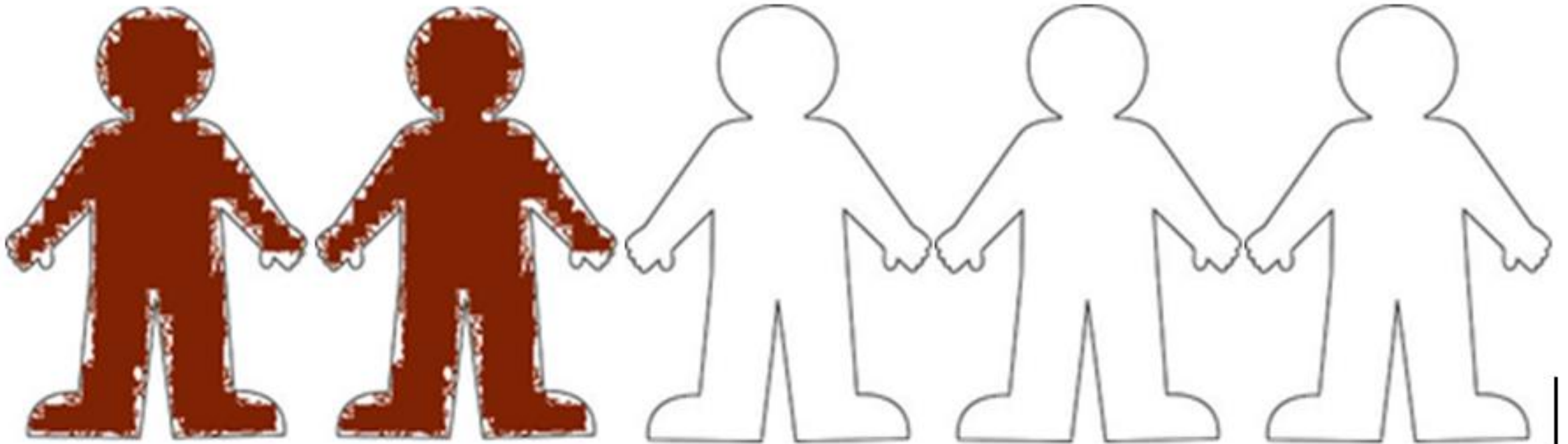
What happens to students who don't promote from Mae Hensley?

- *Referred to an alternative high school (e.g., Argus or Endeavor) within 1 year: 2 of 4 (51%)*



What happens to students who don't promote from Mae Hensley?

- *Serious discipline issues in high school: 2 of 5 (40%)*



7th Grade Promotion Requirements

- Students must earn a minimum of 60 credits in their 7th grade year.

Requirements

For students to participate in the 8th grade trip, Promotion ceremony and celebration, they must earn:

- Cumulative grade point average of 2.00
- Minimum of 60 credits

Grade Point Average

- Often referred to as GPA
- GPA is calculated at the end of each quarter:
 - Each letter grade is assigned a numerical value
 - A=4
 - B=3
 - C=2
 - D=1
 - F=0
- The average of the letter grades your child received from all 7 classes is their GPA
- Students must received a *minimum* cumulative GPA of a 2.0

Measure	Promotion Criteria	Total Credits Possible
Language Arts	“D” grade or better (2.5 per quarter)	10
Math	“D” grade or better (2.5 per quarter)	10
Science	“D” grade or better (2.5 per quarter)	10
Social Studies	“D” grade or better (2.5 per quarter)	10
PE	“D” grade or better (2.5 per quarter)	10
Elective	“D” grade or better (2.5 per quarter)	10
Elective/Support	“D” grade or better (2.5 per quarter)	10
After School Tutoring	18 hours (2.5 per quarter)	10
Total Credits Possible <i>each year</i>		80
Total Credits Required for Promotion		60

Monitoring Success

- Grade reports are mailed home the week after each quarter ends.
- Progress reports are mailed home midway through each quarter.
- If a student receives a “D” or “F” grade, please contact the teacher directly to work out a plan for success.
 - Progress reports are sent in plenty of time to raise a failing grade to a passing grade by the end of the quarter.
- If your child falls below the minimum requirements, you will be contacted by the Learning Director or Counseling Technician.
 - A meeting will be set up to discuss a plan for success.

Preparing for High School: UC A-G Requirements

In high school, students will need to meet requirements to go straight to a four year college. In every case, the student must meet the requirement with a grade of “C” or better.

- 2 years of **World** and **US History**
- 4 years **English**.
- At least 3 years of **Math** classes (highly recommended to take additional math classes).
- 1 Life **Science** (Bio or Anatomy) AND 1 Physical **Science** (Chemistry or Physics)
- **2 years of a foreign language (3 Year Recommended)**
- 1 **Fine Art** (art, theater art, choir, dance, and band classes)
- Additional 1 year of **college prep elective**
